I attended the 2nd Area 72 CPC quarterly in Edmonds on May 3rd. There were 23 members in person and 3 on zoom. We had a potluck noon. Business started at 1pm.

The first item of business was a presentation from an assistant principal at a north Seattle high school. Her name is Julia and she gave us tips on how to make the approach and have success setting up panel meetings for both students and the faculty.

We next spent some time doing some scripted role playing on how to approach professionals in different fields. Our Area CPC chair, Sooz, created 7 different scripts using AI. It was impressive.

We had another speaker who is new to sobriety but a 20 year public defender who has represented tons of people with alcohol related charges. He said the number one thing that his clients would hang up about Alcoholics Anonymous was "I dont want religion shoved down my throat". We members, obviously, have not found that to be true but that seems to be the way many potential alcoholics see our program.

- Providing Big Books and other conferenceapproved literature to correctional facilities for inmates to request.100% of these literature requests are funded by GSIG Pink Can Fund Donations.
- Provide newly released members with an AA member on the outside prior to their release to help get those members to their first AA meeting on the outside.
- Writing letters to men and women who want recovery support while they serve time.
- Serve as a clearinghouse of information that District corrections chairs and individual Ms can bring back to their groups.

Puyallup Jail is still closed.

We serve the following areas: *Puyallup, Eatonville, Orting Area* 

Contributions for the Pink Can have been amazing. I will continue to pass it around at various meetings here at the Loft. Additional Pink Cans are being made for other Correction Chairs for their Home Groups as well.

Literature Donations: Examples of literature would be Big Book, 12 & 12, As Bill Sees It, Grapevines, The Plain Language Big Book as well. Hard back books are not acceptable as donations for institutions. I continue to collect literature and bring them to CSO accordingly.

The **Correspondence Program** is basically like a Sober Pen Pal who shares their experience, strength and hope with an inmate.
